Rejoice...Ok, But Why?

What we can experience the most in Church this weekend is joy, in fact this is the weekend of joy, so among the candles of the Advent wreath we do not light a purple candle - a symbol of penance, renunciation and preparation - but a pink candle, a symbol of joy and serenity.

Thinking back to when I could particularly rejoice recently, the first thing that comes to mind is the trip we took with the groups of Grail Seekers and Student Youth to the Isle of Wight. We went to visit the Benedictine nuns of St Cecilia's Monastery.

The encounter was extraordinary. First of all, what struck us was the average age of the women who welcomed us. One usually sees people of a certain age more frequently in the church, so, thinking of a cloistered convent, one imagines to find only elderly women, as they still cultivate such faith in Jesus that they accept a life of prayer enclosed within the four walls of a convent. Instead, we were welcomed by very young women, full of joy, of life, of light in their eyes: we were impressed! From that moment on, when I think of joy, the first thing that comes to mind is the faces of those women.

One of the boys, during a brief assembly at the end of the visit to the convent, said that he was very impressed by how these women, despite not having mobile phones or all the comforts one normally has, are so happy.

It is an observation that should make us reflect: in what does true joy consist?

Can it come from having so many things? The nuns personally possess nothing.

Can it come from being without problems? I think that in a place where 35 women are enclosed, however holy they may be, living together is certainly not easy, and problems are not lacking.

Leaving the question unanswered for a moment, I would like to tell you about another moment of joy. Last Sunday in the hall of Bishop's Waltham church, some parishioners organised a Christmas party for the local children. Seeing these carefree children playing, jumping, having fun was another moment of joy and confirmation of Jesus' words: those who are like children will enter the Kingdom of Heaven, which means that the Kingdom of Heaven is a Kingdom of joy and gladness.

So, going back to the original question, where does joy come from? I would like to quote a piece from the book written by Sister Mary David, one of the nuns of St Cecilia who died recently, entitled: *The Joy of GOD* (which I recommend everyone to read, it is very good!). At one point, talking about joy she says: "There is joy of surrendering to God's will, of being and doing at every moment what he desires us to be and do. This liberation from slavery to self-will is a real source of supernatural joy". In other words, joy is the joyful surrender to the will of an Other who loves us, and that is exactly what the children at the Christmas party did: they were joyful and enjoying themselves because they were with their parents who loved them.

Continuing on the theme of joy, Sister Mary David writes: "The joy of being called, and of being called together". So joy comes from being called in a communion. But what is the greatest call we all received? The call to be a Christian, and so to belong to God's people through baptism.

Here it is: to be a Christian, to be a beloved person whom God has chosen, this alone is the true source of joy, of a joy that no social, economic, physical or moral condition can ever destroy.

Let us live this joy by showing it to the world, just as those sisters on the Isle of Wight and those children at the party showed, thus giving us a glimpse of God's smile.
