EVERY CLOUD HAS A SILVER LINING

The other day I washed some jumpers, as soon as they were dry I went to the laundry room (it's a small shed in our backyard), folded them nicely and went out; it was evening and someone had turned off the light in the yard thinking that no one was there. So I found myself having to go from the laundry shed to the kitchen in total darkness. I took a step, it was fine, I took another step, it was fine, at the third step there was a step to take, I climbed up the step, but my foot slipped off, because the step leads to a kind of pavement made of wooden boards that if they are a bit damp become very slippery! In short, I fell to the ground on my knee and sank a few centimetres into the mud. I started saying bad words, because in slipping my washed and nicely folded jumpers had fallen to the ground. I went to the kitchen, turned on the light and my trousers were completely muddy. I have to be honest: I said too many bad words... but at least it was in Hungarian, so if anyone was listening they wouldn't understand... but God hears and understands everything!

I was angry because my trousers got muddy and even some of my jumpers got dirty. So when I went to bed, I tried to thank Jesus for that day and to apologise for the bad words that had come out of my mouth because of that incident, but I was still very angry. The next day I went into the backyard and saw the hole made by my knee: it was 2 cm from the concrete edge of the pavement; just two centimetres further and I would have broken my knee! At that instant I realised the grace I had received: a dirty trouser instead of a broken knee. I thanked Jesus - this time much more sincerely and pacified - for the grace of not having hurt myself.

Often unforeseen things happen and we get angry because they create distress for us, because we would like to be perfect, but we are not, and our inabilities win out.

The real problem is that we tend to look at reality only from our point of view, having our own idea of how things should be, and we do not realise that despite our infirmities, or rather, precisely through our infirmities and mistakes, it is Jesus who acts, both for our good and for the good of the people around us. So, it is important to widen our mind and recognise the presence of Jesus beside us, also when things go wrong.

Paying attention to what happened to me has helped me to remember that there is a good God who loves me; this is also what the problems the gospel speaks of on this Sunday are for: poverty, hunger, crying, people who hate you... these are all seemingly unfavourable circumstances, but those who experience them are called blessed. The reason is simple: in those conditions one is much better able to recognise where the true good comes from and therefore to whom to entrust oneself, thus changing complaint and anger into praise and thanksgiving.



Fellowship Group - No meeting during Half Term. The next meeting will be on Wednesday 26th February at St Swithun Wells Church, 7.30pm-9pm.


